本校自 2000 年開始對國內學校進行訪問活動,隨後陸續與北京市第九中學、北京市第十四中學及浙江省的鎮海中學結成姊妹學校。疫情過後,本校於 2023 年 6 月與南京三所學校(南京市第五十中學、南京師範大學附屬中學實驗初級中學及南京師範大學附屬中學行知分校)簽訂合作協議書,並於同年 12 月,再與位於深圳的中國科學院深圳理工大學附屬實驗高級中學簽訂合作協議書。
